THE GRADING SYSTEM

Subjects are graded:

High Distinction	—	Outstanding performance (introduced 1964)
Distinction	—	Superior performance
Credit	—	Good performance
Pass	—	Acceptable level of performance
Satisfactory #Pass	}	— Satisfactory completion of a subject for which graded passes are not awarded
Pass Conceded	—	Concessional pass allowing progression to another subject for which the subject was a prerequisite
Pass Terminating	—	Concessional pass not allowing progression to another subject for which the subject was a prerequisite
Audited subject	—	Assessment not completed; only applicable to subjects not undertaken as part of a degree or diploma
Completed requirements	—	Subject undertaken at another tertiary institution
Fail	—	Unsatisfactory performance
Absent Fail	—	Unsatisfactory performance; assessment not completed
Withdrew Fail	—	Discontinued with failure

THE ACADEMIC YEAR

For most courses the academic year is from March to December and is divided into 2 sessions each of 14 weeks duration. A subject may extend over 1 session only or both sessions.

The academic year for the Medicine course Years 3, 4 and 5, commences in January and is divided into terms although results are recorded under sessions.

For courses offered by the Australian Graduate School of Management the academic year is divided into 3 terms each of 10 weeks.

DEFERRED EXAMINATIONS

Deferred examinations were last held in January 1978.

HONOURS GRADINGS

Honours are available for all degree courses except those offered by the Faculty of Law. Further information concerning the level of attainment of any person who has completed a degree in the Faculty of Law is available from the Dean, Faculty of Law.
